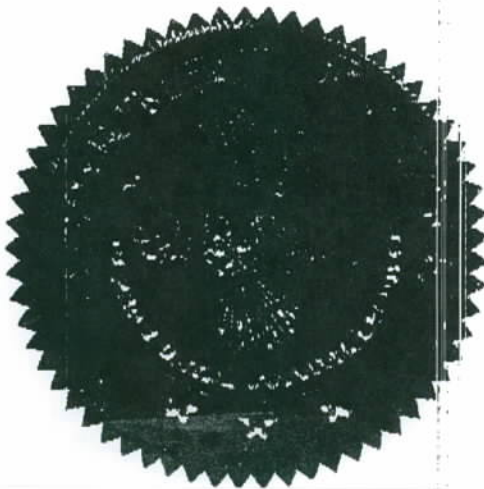

Be It Known, THAT THIS DAY THE PRESIDENT HAS GRANTED UNTO

JOHN GEORGE STOESSINGER

A FULL AND UNCONDITIONAL PARDON

AND HAS DESIGNATED, DIRECTED AND EMPOWERED THE DEPUTY ATTORNEY GENERAL AS HIS REPRESENTATIVE TO SIGN THIS GRANT OF EXECUTIVE CLEMENCY TO THE ABOVE WHO WAS CONVICTED IN THE UNITED STATES DISTRICT COURT FOR THE SOUTHERN DISTRICT OF NEW YORK ON AN INFORMATION (DOC. NO. 76 CR 881) CHARGING VIOLATION OF SECTION 4, TITLE 18, UNITED STATES CODE, AND ON JANUARY EIGHTEEN 1977, WAS SENTENCED TO EIGHTEEN MONTHS' PROBATION.



IN ACCORDANCE WITH THESE INSTRUCTIONS AND AUTHORITY I HAVE SIGNED MY NAME AND CAUSED THE SEAL OF THE DEPARTMENT OF JUSTICE TO BE AFFIXED BELOW AND AFFIRM THAT THIS ACTION IS THE ACT OF THE PRESIDENT BEING PERFORMED AT HIS DIRECTION.


Dear Dr. Stoessinger:
